The TYF is a conduit between Filipinos and others who want to help, and Filipinos anywhere in the country who are in need.

Many Filipinos want to help others, but do not know how. The TYF provides them the mechanisms to do so.

First, donors decide how to help - whether by contributing their finances, goods or services.

Second, donors choose whom to help - any of our beneficiaries clustered into six categories: Children's Basic Needs, Education and Formation, Livelihood and Environment, Relief and Rehabilitation, and the Elderly and Infirm; or any individual, institution or community not yet counted among our partner-beneficiaries.

Third, if donors opt to help financially, they choose whether to do so through cash, check, or credit card.

Moreover, if donors wish to stagger their donations, they can make monthly or quarterly pledges through their credit card. In other words, TYF facilitates the process by which people who want to help are able to reach out to those in need.

Beneficiaries, on the other hand, enter a MOA with TYF, stipulating the nature of the assistance and the responsibilities of the recipients. The TYF reports to benefactors how their resources have been used and whose lives they somehow were able to transform.
